EXCEPTION PROCESS FOR UNDOCUMENTED INDIVIDUALS (SX02) – PT 54

DECEMBER 6, 2017

Undocumented individuals are eligible for substance use disorder (SUD) residential treatment for ASAM levels 3.7 and 3.7WM. Providers that are seeking an authorization exception for an undocumented individual (SX02) must complete the Request for Reimbursement for Non-Medicaid Services exception form and submit the documentation to their local authority (local addictions authority or local behavioral health authority). Providers should select either SUD Residential ASAM Level 3.7 or 3.7WM under Level of Care Requested and should select Non-US Citizen / Undocumented under the Financial Reason for Exception. Below are screenshots for reference when completing your documentation.
