## OTPs and Congregate Living Facilities Including RRPs Reporting Positive COVID-19 Test Results

## April 13, 2021

Optum Maryland and the Maryland Department of Health's Behavioral Health Administration (BHA) would like to remind providers of the mandatory reporting of COVID-19 positive test results.

**Behavioral Health Providers**: We remain in a Public Health Emergency, and there continues to be significant community spread of COVID-19, and variants of concern, across our state. By memo dated <u>September 15, 2020, from the Deputy Secretary to providers</u>, OTPs and Congregate Living Facilities were advised of the mandatory reporting of COVID-19 positive test results.

It has been brought to BHA's attention that some behavioral health providers have not been reporting positive COVID-19 test results and/or not cooperating with local health department investigations surrounding the positive tests or recommendations to address the outbreak. By statute and regulations, if a congregate living facility or health care provider is aware of a positive COVID-19 test result, the facility or health care provider must report the information to the Health Officer of the County where the facility is located. If your program experiences a positive case, you must contact your Local Health Department for their recommendations for testing, isolation, and quarantining of patients and/or staff. Their guidance regarding admissions and when staff may return to work after a positive test result should be obtained and followed. Additionally, BHA will provide technical support and assistance as needed. Failure to cooperate may subject the facility and health care provider to disciplinary action.

In addition to reporting to the Local Health Department, the following programs are to report the positive test result(s) to BHA and the appropriate LBHA/LAA and CSA:

- Opioid Treatment Programs (OTPs)
- Residential Crisis Beds
- ASAM SUD Residential Programs

- Group Homes
- Recovery Residences
- Residential Rehabilitation Programs (RRPs)
- Other congregate living facilities.

All referenced program types are to utilize the <u>Positive COVID-19 Test Reporting Form</u> found on the <u>BHA website</u>.

This reporting requirement is effective immediately. If you have any concerns or questions, please contact BHA Medical Director, Dr. Steve Whitefield at <u>Steven.Whitefield@Maryland.gov</u>.

BHA may pursue disciplinary action against non-compliant providers. In addition, non-compliant providers may be deemed not eligible for funding made available to assist providers with COVID-19 related issues.
