Application Cycle Open for New COVID-19 Provider Funding

On September 29, a new application cycle opened for \$25.5B in COVID-19 provider funding. Applicants are able to apply for both Provider Relief Fund (PRF) Phase 4 and American Rescue Plan (ARP) Rural payments during the application process using a single application.

- PRF Phase 4 is open to a broad range of providers with changes in operating revenues and expenses.
- ARP Rural is open to providers who serve rural beneficiaries covered by Medicare, Medicaid, or the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP).

Applications must be received by October 26 at 11:59 p.m. ET.

HRSA FUNDING ANNOUNCEMENTS

Health Center Construction and Renovation Projects

HRSA <u>awarded</u> nearly \$1B in American Rescue Plan funding to close to 1,300 HRSA-funded health centers to support major construction and renovation projects. These awards will strengthen primary health care infrastructure and advance health equity and health outcomes in medically underserved communities, including through projects that support COVID-19 testing, treatment, and vaccination.

Funding to Health Centers for Ending the HIV Epidemic in the U.S. Initiative

HRSA <u>awarded</u> over \$48M to 271 HRSA-funded health centers to expand HIV prevention and treatment, including pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) related services, outreach, and care coordination, as part of the <u>Ending the HIV</u> <u>Epidemic in the U.S. (EHE)</u> initiative in selected counties, territories, and states.

Award recipients: FY 2021 Ending the HIV Epidemic-Primary Care HIV Prevention

Expanding Services at Health Center Program School-Based Service Sites

HRSA <u>awarded</u> over \$5M to 27 HRSA-funded health centers to expand services at new or existing service delivery sites located at or on the grounds of a school. Health centers will use this funding to expand services, including primary care, behavioral health, oral health, vision, and enabling services such as transportation, outreach, and translation services at school-based service sites, both in-person and through telehealth.

Award recipients: Health Center Program Service Expansion: School-Based Service Sites

Strengthening Maternal and Child Health

HRSA <u>awarded</u> nearly \$350M in awards to states and non-profit organizations to support safe pregnancies and healthy babies. Funding will expand home visiting services to families most in need, increase access to doulas, address health disparities in infant deaths, and improve data reporting on maternal mortality.
