## UPDATE: Public Comment on Involuntary Commitment Workgroup Report

September 1, 2021

## Target Audience: All Behavioral Health Providers

The Behavioral Health Administration has extended the deadline for community stakeholders to provide input on the Involuntary Commitment Stakeholders' Work group Report. Please see the new date below.

Dear Community Stakeholder,

Over the last several months, Maryland's Behavioral Health Administration (BHA) and numerous community and state-level partners met in an effort to better define involuntary civil commitment. Now, we want your input no later than **September 10**, **2021**.

This MDH-organized group reviewed national best practices on involuntary civil commitment and developed several recommendations to provide greater clarity to Maryland's civil commitment definition.

Three recommendations emerged:

- 1. Refine the definition of the dangerousness standard in regulations;
- 2. Provide comprehensive training around the dangerousness standard;
- 3. Gather additional data elements about involuntary civil commitment.
